Levels of Support

At Hagley we ensure we meet the learning needs of all our pupils through our excellent teaching and learning, providing differentiated work and a personalised approach.

Wave 1 Quality First Teaching

This is the delivery of high quality, inclusive teaching within the classroom taking account of the learning needs of all pupils.

Wave 2

This is for pupils who may require further support to help them to meet agerelated expectations. Additional help may be provided through group interventions with those pupils who have similar needs.

Wave 3

This is for a minority of pupils where individual highly-tailored interventions take place to accelerate progress to enable them to achieve their potential.

The Graduated Response

At Hagley we follow a graduated approach in line with the SEND Code of Practice where children's needs are assessed; individual targets are planned, implemented and reviewed on a regular cycle.

SEN Support

For those pupils who, despite targeted group support, are making little or no progress, external agencies may be involved to advise school and assist further. This need is now referred to as 'SEN Support' and Individual Provision Maps will be created for your child and reviewed termly with parents.

Education Health Care Plans [EHCP's]

In a minority of cases, some pupils whose need for long term support at a highly tailored individual level may require an EHCP.



Four Areas of Special Educational Need (SEN)

- 1. Communication and interaction
- 2. Cognition and learning
- 3. Social, emotional and mental health
- 4. Sensory and/or physical needs
