
## What is Phonics?

- Letter sounds initially, then letter names
- Pure sound, not schwa

#### Terminology:

- Fred talk
- Fred fingers (segmenting to write)
- Fred in your head (blending to read)
- Red words (tricky words): the, I, of, no, go, he
- Special friends (digraphs)









## Reading


- In school reading: decoding, comprehension, prosody (reading like a reader)

- Half termly assessment and year 1 Phonics check






