



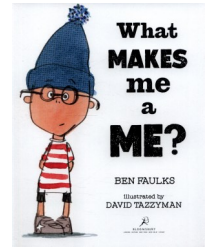
Nursery News

Friday 10th October



Mini Me

This week, we have continued to explore the beautiful story “What Makes Me a Me” by Ben Faulks. The children have been thinking deeply about what makes each of us unique — the things we love, how we look, what we can do, and what makes us the same and different.



Through small-world play and self-portraits, the children have been developing their language and communication skills — describing themselves and their friends, and listening carefully to each other's ideas. These moments of talk and discovery help children grow in confidence and self-awareness, supporting their early understanding of identity and belonging.

Maths Adventures

Our maths adventures have taken us outdoors this week! The children have been practising counting through song — “One Potato, Two Potato” and “One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Once I Caught a Fish Alive” — and exploring numbers in the environment. We have used conkers to count real objects in hands-on play to make learning meaningful. Next week, we'll begin exploring subitising — recognising small quantities (1–3) without counting each one.

Celebrating Black History Month

As part of Black History Month celebrations, we have been listening to the story “I am Brown” which is a joyful story that celebrates pride, identity and the beauty of difference. The children have been talking about skin tones, families, and feelings of love and belonging.
